"89 Again" project was launched on the 25th anniversary of the beginning of "Palach's week." It is based on following historical events that culminated on November 17th, 1989. It offers not only facts, dates and personal stories, but also the context of the times, such as from the neighbouring states of The Czech Republic.

"We are very happy that the project has reached such popularity among social network users and website visitors. We believe that there will be more likes to come. '89 Again' is going to run live throughout next year, covering events up to December 1989. New articles, archive sound material, contemporary photographs and samples of the contemporary print is going to be continuously published on special webpages," says the Project Manager Ruzbeth Oweyssi.

"In the course of the summer holidays we have been following the bizarre reaction of the regime to the declaration of Several Sentences. We also covered what was going on in culture and sport at that time, and found some plans that have never been realized to this day – such as the planned system of underground trams in Brno," adds the Project Editor Dušan Radovanovič.

- lifestyle of the times: technology news, culture, sport
- "opráski" a comic journey through the history with intentionally exaggerated gramatic and spelling errors
